Meeting date is the 23rd, the 4th Tuesday. The meeting in March will have the theme of Light.

In the first hour, we will see a 30 minute video lecture from the Fundamentals of Photography course we recently purchased for the Club. The title of the lecture is Light - Color and Intensity. The lecturer, Joel Sartore, is a photographer for National Geographic. In this lecture, one of 3 on light, he discusses and illustrates the color of different types of light and how they appear in photographs; the differences between hard and soft light; and how to adjust the camera to maximize its potential in dealing with these various attributes of light.

In the second hour, we will convene a panel of 'experts' to field questions from the membership. Hopefully the questions will be on the subject of light, suggested by the video, or perhaps of longstanding interest. Questions on other subjects may also be directed at the panel if they prove agreeable. The membership are encouraged to come prepared, take notes and participate in the program.






