The November Meeting will be our annual photo contest. Each member may submit one photograph. It must not have been previously entered in a forum or shown at the club. The rules:

- 1 The photo must have been taken within the past two years.
- 2 Photo must be at least 8 by 10 or equivalent 80 square inches. There is no maximum size.
- 3 Photo must be mounted on rigid mounting board, i.e. foam core or other rigid board.
- 4 Photo MAY be matted or matted and framed. Prints on canvas are allowed.
- 5 Bring your photo COVERED so the image is not visible.
